GAME CHANGER CHALLENGE

The Game Changer Challenge is a program that has been created to develop student's design thinking skills. The student team comprises of Kai, Kiani and Jasper from Nimbin working with Indi, Tiara and Oscar all from Year 7 at Kyogle. We have travelled twice to Nimbin Central School to develop the concepts, script and storyboards. Following this the team has been busy filming and recording narration. Our student team, The Inexpendables, explored the concept of how useful it would be to build more respectful and positive relationships with our technology.

We were successful! We are now bound for Sydney for three days in August to develop our concept further in conjunction with Google during Education Week.

What will we do in Sydney?

Days 1 & 2 will see teams undergo a live sprint using design thinking processes to create a solution to the Challenge question, *How might we humanise technology?* The sprint will be led by experienced design thinking facilitators and will allow teachers the opportunity to reflect on how they might use this creative problem solving framework in their own classrooms.

Day 3 is Pitch Day! Teams will present their solutions to the Challenge question in front of a live audience and panel of judges made up of industry and department executives.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

The Kyogle High School community was over the moon to receive the information earlier in the week that our collaboration with Nimbin Central for an entry into the Game Changer Challenge was successful. Well done Mr O'Meara, Oscar, Indii and Tiara who will be travelling to Sydney in August.

Excursions

Excursions take a lot of planning and paperwork to ensure we are meeting Department of Education guidelines. There are mandated requirements around permission notes, risk assessments, advising staff of students participating etc. For this reason there is a cut off for permission notes and money 48hours prior to the excursion. Each permission note clearly stipulates the 'cut off date' and I am instructing staff this must be followed to ensure equity for all students. If parents can not pay the money by the due date, I am happy to have a conversation (or the DP) and we can work out when payments can be made.

Healthy Canteen

Our canteen has had an audit conducted by the NSW Health—Healthy Eating Active Living Team. Every canteen throughout NSW is required to participate in this audit and follow recommendations before the end of the year. A report will be tabled at the P&C meeting regarding the audit. Thank you to Deb Skinner, our Canteen Supervisor for supporting this initiative.

Staff Development

Parents are aware that this year Kyogle HS has a coordinated approach to improving the teaching and learning within our school. On Tuesday 4 June, staff stayed back at school to participate in peer lead learning around three of our focus areas: Learning Intentions, Effective Feedback and Effective Questioning. Thank you to the presenters for each session and also to Mr Hanley for his organisation of afternoon tea and dinner.

Uniform

Uniform continues to be a focus in our school. We have a uniform that is supported by our P&C and is affordable and easy to wear. During the winter months, students can wear plain black jeans/pants (no rips or tears) and plain green jumpers, although the school jumper and jacket is available through the uniform shop. At no time can students wear exercise tights except when their PE teacher allows them to change for a specific lesson. No student who is out of uniform will be allowed to go on an excursion. There is student assistance available for the purchase of uniforms. Local football jumpers and shorts are not part of our uniform and must not be worn to school. I ask that parents support our uniform policy.

Subject Selection

Students in Year 8 and Year 10 will start to be thinking about subjects for next year. I encourage students to think carefully about the choices they make as changes to pattern of study are not always possible. One way to think about your subjects is to use the PAIN model:

P - past performance. In what subjects have you received high results?

A - aptitude. Do you have a particular talent?

I - Interest. Where do your interests lie?

N - need. Are there subjects you need for your career path?
